




PARTNERSHIP OUTCOMES

vertical aquaponics system

In partnership with The Food Connection and a grant from the UK Student Sustainability Council, FoodChain built their first mobile, vertical aquaponics system. The system was designed entirely by FoodChain staff, and then built in collaboration with UK students and faculty. Since then, the system has been featured in presentations to students, plants have gone out to student's dorm rooms, the fish names were awarded through a democratic process, and produce from this system was used in a meal at the Food Connection during the Executive Director's presentation. At the end of this year the system will stay at UK and move to its forever home with The Food Connection.







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food system education

Throughout the partnership, FoodChain worked with **4 different classes**. They created student volunteering opportunities including feeding the fish, checking water quality, and caring for the plants.

In total about 100 students checked on the system, but countless more interacted with it just from exposure in the space- the fish name voting was especially popular! In total, it is estimated that FoodChain worked with 10 professors over the partnership.
