partnering with Lexington's civic institutions to change how they work.





Community Impact

The partnership between CivicLex and the University of Kentucky through the Community Innovation Partnership has advanced civic engagement and education in Lexington. By hosting accessible and interactive events such as the Park Workshop, Pumpkins, Policy, and Paint Brushes, and a Primary Candidate Meet & Greet, CivicLex created dynamic entry points for civic discourse that welcomed students, community members, faculty, and local leaders. These programs not only increased awareness of local government processes but also helped build trust and dialogue across different segments of the community. The Cornerstone became a civic hub — a neutral, community-facing space where residents could access civic education, engage in political dialogue, and develop the tools to participate more fully in public life. Through this partnership, CivicLex was able to broaden its impact on Lexington's civic health, providing a meaningful response to the challenge of low civic participation and creating lasting public value.

Institutional Impact

Institutionally, the partnership has enriched the University of Kentucky's academic and community engagement landscape by connecting 12 faculty members and students from 8 different courses to applied, real-world civic learning experiences.

This integration of CivicLex's programming into academic life has underscored the university's commitment to experiential learning, community-based problem solving, and civic responsibility.
